Listening

Ages 12-14

Listening

Reflect silently on the words from the Scripture passage. Think about some of the ways you seek forgiveness for your sins. How do you feel about knowing Jesus is our way to forgiveness? Through his death on the cross Jesus saved us from sin. He is the means of God's forgiveness as well. We celebrate God's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This is a great gift and grace for us.

Reflect on the last time you received the Sacrament of Reconciliation. How did you feel before you went to talk to the priest? How did you feel after you received forgiveness?
