CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand Saying "Yes" to God God speaks to us in many ways. We simply need to learn to listen to his voice. Before children can understand what it means to say "yes" to God, they must understand how to recognize the call of God. They can do this when adults in their lives help them to hear God's Word in Scripture. Children also experience God's call in their talents, dreams, and opportunities in their daily lives. As time goes on, your child will become better and better at answering the question, "What might God be saying to me right now?"

When did you realize that your perspective was limited by your personal experience?

You may have realized this when you got married and your spouse's family did things differently, or when you went to a foreign country, or made a friend from another place in the world. As human beings we are limited. We need God's help to recognize what is truth.
