CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand the Lessons Your child has begun to understand that he or she is not the only person in the world. He or she can learn to see things from perspectives other than their own, which means they are beginning to develop empathy and compassion.

At age seven or eight most children are capable of making moral choices. You can help your child develop morally by giving them good examples and clear moral guidelines. With that your child will be able to choose between right and wrong.

At this age children love to celebrate. Many like music and find comfort in ritual. Try singing some hymns at home with them and using gestures when you pray as a family. Don't hesitate to do spontaneous prayer with your child or to have him lead family prayer.


