CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

This feature gives you a sense of how your child, at this particular age, will likely be able to understand what is being taught. It suggests ways you can help your child better understand, live, and love their faith

How They Understand Children this age like to be challenged and are capable of learning abstract concepts. Your child may ask more critical thinking questions about faith and beliefs than he or she has asked before. This is a normal process of trying to understand and find out to what you believe. When your child asks questions, answer simply and honestly.

- Children at this age are often capable of sacrificing their own self interests for others or for the common good. Their peer group is very important to them.
- They are usually aware of both their gifts and their limitations and can view their actions and motives objectively.
- They find comfort in rules and guidelines and need to know what the rules are and what the consequences are for breaking the rules.
- Children at this age generally love clubs and all of the rituals and items that members of a club share. Use this inclination and participate in the rituals, actions, and symbols of our faith and Sacraments.
