CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand God's Call We often ask children at this age what they would like to be when they grow up. Seldom are they asked what God is calling them to be. God made us, and he knows us better than we know ourselves. We cannot be happier than when we are doing what we were made for. Children this age are ready to begin to consider, based on their interests, talents, and opportunities, where God might be leading them.



CONSIDER THIS >>>

How much influence do you have on helping your child discover God's plan for his or her life?

According to research, parents are the number one influence in their child's life. The Church recognizes the role of parents as not only influential, but the primary influence in helping their child grow in faith. As Catholics, we know that "the Christian family is called to be a community of faith, hope, and love in an environment of prayer. Aided by a number of other virtues, such as prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance, the family that practices them begins to actualize its spiritual calling as a domestic church" (USCCA, p. 377).

- Share a family story about the Sacrament of Matrimony.
