CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand the Mass Some children at this age have difficulty engaging in the Mass, perhaps because the language of the Mass, hymns, and homily often feel very much directed toward the adults in the parish. Helping your child become familiar with what happens at Mass, the words that are said and their meanings can help him or her to begin to decode what may otherwise feel like a very adult event. At the same time, we need to retain our sense of awe and mystery at the miracle of God's love unfolding before us.



CONSIDER THIS >>>


Why is it so important to gather together for meals?

Eating together helps us grow and gain a greater sense of belonging and a true sense of ourselves. Those same human longings guide us to Mass. Here we are strengthened in our identity as members of the Body of Christ and grow in deeper communion with one another. "Holy Communion increases our union with Christ. Just as bodily food sustains our physical life, so Holy Communion nourishes our spiritual life. This Communion moves us away from sin, strengthening our moral resolve to avoid evil and turn ever more powerfully toward God" (USCCA, p. 223).
