## CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand the Liturgy of the Eucharist Many children have heard the words of the Liturgy of the Eucharist without fully realizing or understanding what they mean. It is hard for children this age to understand how and why Jesus gave himself as a sacrifice for all of humanity. The ritual form of this portion of the Mass will help your child to continue to reflect upon and grow in his or her understanding of Christ's sacrifice and its meaning for each of us.



## **CONSIDER THIS >>>**

What have you sacrificed for your children as a gift of love?

Becoming a parent sets one on a lifelong journey of sacrifice—sacrifices that come from love. This love gives us a glimpse of the love and sacrifice of Jesus. "In a self-centered culture where people are taught to extend themselves only for something in return, the sacrifices each of us make, following the example of Jesus, who freely sacrificed his life in love for all, point to the reality and power of God's love for us" (USCCA, p. 221).

- Talk with your child about when he or she will have First Communion
