## CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

How They Understand Prayer Third-graders are capable of talking with Jesus as a friend. This is a good time to encourage your child to speak to God in his or her own words. The social nature of children this age also makes them especially amenable to praying with the family or in groups if they are given the structure and guidance necessary to do so. Take some time for family prayer, and encourage your child to take the lead.



## **CONSIDER THIS >>>**

How necessary is it to be open to what someone has to say?

Real communication requires an openness of mind and heart. Opening our minds and hearts to hear what God has to sav is the root of the sacred practice of prayer. "The Catechism reminds us that the Lord Jesus asks us to believe in order to pray and to pray in order to believe. There is a complementarity in which knowing and loving God support each other. Belief in the Father, Son, and Spirit should be essentially and immediately connected to a prayerful and loving communion with the Trinity" (USCCA, p. 491).

## LET'S TALK >>>

- Ask your child to talk about the things that he or she prays about most often.
- Talk about the different places you pray throughout the day.
