CHILDREN AT THIS AGE >>>

This section gives you a sense of how your child will likely be able to understand the topics taught. It suggests ways you can help your child better understand and live their faith.

How They Understand Children this age typically want to be independent, and doing things together with their peers is important to them. However, they are just beginning to "come out of themselves." Some days they will appear older than their years and other days they will seem younger. Remember to be patient with your child as he or she experiments with new ways of talking or behaving.

At this age children will have begun to internalize and express a moral code that is shaped in your family as well as in school and by the Church. They may seem very concerned about fairness and rights. Rules and regulations are the measure of right and wrong for them. At times they may appear legalistic and judgmental of themselves and others.

You can nurture your child's sense of Catholic morality. Give him or her opportunities to consider better or best choices, not just right or wrong choices. Help him or her see how their words and actions can affect others.
