How They Understand the Great Commandment

The Great Commandment of Jesus makes sense to your child, who is capable of seeing how all of the other Commandments fit into these larger categories. At a time when rules are sometimes seen by a child this age as stifling his or her independence, the Great Commandment can be a useful shorthand to encourage critical thinking and self-reflection on moral issues.



CONSIDER THIS >>>

What makes you lovable?

Do you find it hard to answer that question? Knowing why we are lovable might seem to fly in the face of humility. Yet, knowing ourselves as a beloved child of God is the very core of our faith. You were created by love, in love. How could you be more loved? As Catholics, we know that "human life, as a profound unity of physical and spiritual dimensions, is sacred. It is distinct from all other forms of life, since it alone is imprinted with the very image of its Creator" (USCCA, p. 310).
