Feast of the Holy Family

The Feast of the Holy Family is celebrated on the Sunday after Christmas unless Christmas falls on a Sunday. Then it is celebrated on December 30. The Christmas Season is, in a very real way, a celebration of the Holy Family—and of your family—because you are called to be holy, too. Holiness is not an abstract idea. It includes times of kindness and compassion as well as times of forgiving and asking forgiveness within your own family.

Make the feast a family celebration by having family members share in preparing a meal or inviting another family over for a pot luck dinner. Follow the meal with games and or a sing-along of Christmas music.
