Preparation for the Session

Turn to Page 55, the Family + Faith page. *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 111

In this chapter you will cover the following objectives:

- Identify the Bible as God's Word written by humans
- Appreciate that God made everything and all of creation is good
- Understand that God made humans to be his friends, to know him and love him

Read the **Consider This** feature. What thoughts or reactions do you have to the opening question?

Parents, Consider This: This first chapter begins at the beginning, explaining that all human beings are created in the image of God. We possess dignity because we are mirrors that reflect God's splendor and his goodness. It's easy to see, then, how you are your child's best teacher of faith. You see him/her with the eyes of God. You truly know how unique and good he/she is. When you teach your child this truth of our faith he/she will be able to recognize the preciousness of their own life as well as the value of the lives of others.

INVITE: Encountering God in His Word

Turn to Page 47, Created By God Vivos en Cristo, Page 95 After gathering the supplies that you will need, find a quiet place to be with your child. This is a sacred time—a time when you will be present to each other and to the Lord. You may want to light a candle as you begin.



Let Us Pray Invite your child to make the Sign of the Cross. Read aloud the Psalm verse from the book. Help your child to respond.

Explain that God created the world and everything in it, including people.

Say: Each one of us is different and special because God made us that way. Now, let's hear how wonderful God is to us.



- Proclaim God's Word in the Parchment Paper box on the page.
- Maintain several moments of silence.
- Ask: What did you hear God say to you today?

Invite your child to respond and also share what you heard.

Now, look at the What Do You Wonder? box.

Say: God made each of us. Each one of us is created by God to be who we are. God lives in us and asks us to do things that only we can do. Tell your child the things you think are special about her/him.

DISCOVER: Learning God's Truth

Turn to Page 48, God's Creation *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 97 **Read** aloud the first paragraph.

Show your child a Bible and explain that it is a holy book. It is God's book. Review the word Bible on the page and have your child find it on the cover or front page of the Bible itself.

Read the second paragraph.



Proclaim "The Garden of Eden."

- Invite your child to find the names of the first humans in the text.
- Ask: What else did God create?



Work on the gold-star activity. Provide time for your child to draw themselves into the picture of creation.

Parents, Consider This: Do you recall the wonder and awe you experienced when you first held your child? For those first months everything he/she did was a marvel; smiling, burping, turning over. You must have regularly reflected upon the intricacies of this creature. In these past several years you have had the opportunity to help your child know that he/she is God's beloved creation. You are not the only one who calls this child son or daughter. The Creator of the stars, the sun, and the moon has created your child to forever be in relationship with him.

Turn to Page 49, God Gives Life *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 99 **Share** the information in the paragraph.

Ask: "Who made you?"

Tell your child that you are going to write the word "Creator" on an index card and explain that this is a name for God. Have your child point to the word in the book and call out the letters to you as you print on the index card.

Explain that we recognize our belief in God the Creator when we pray the Apostle's Creed at Mass. Turn to page 299 in the Our Catholic Tradition reference section in the back of the Student Book. Using the index card, ask your child to find the word "Creator" in the Apostle's Creed.



Read aloud the directions for the Share Your Faith activity. Help your child spell out the word "creation." When she/he is finished tell them what your favorite thing that God created is and why.

Turn to Page 50, God Loves You *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 101 Read aloud "God Loves You."

Explain that humans cannot see God, but they know what he is like from the things that he has made and from the Bible. Explain that God is greater and more wonderful than anything people can imagine about him.

Point out the picture of creation. Encourage your child to name what she/he sees.

Ask: Who is the fastest, the tallest, the loudest, the most funny, etc.?



Work on the gold-star activity. Invite your child to circle two of her/his favorite things that God made in the picture.

Turn to Page 51, God's World *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 103 **Ask** the children to stand to celebrate God's wonderful world.

Read "God's World." Work together with your child to invent gestures to go with each line of the poem. Read aloud the poem a second time while your child does the gestures. You may need to remind him/her of what they need to do as you go.



Work on the Connect Your Faith activity with your child. Have them trace the letters to write the word.

LIVE: Living Our Faith

Turn to Page 52,

Our Catholic Life *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 105

Read aloud the first paragraph.

Say: Name some of God's gifts that you can see. (Answers may include people, animals, trees, rain, lakes, mountains, and so on.)

Ask: How do we use some of the things God created? (Answers may include we use trees to build homes, we use people to care for us, we use plants and animals for food.)



Read the directions to the gold-star activity aloud. Work with your child to complete the activity.

Turn to Page 53, People of Faith *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 107



Discuss the first part of the Live Your Faith activity. Ask your child to color the picture. When finished, invite your child to tell you about her/his picture.

Parents, Consider This: Young children sometimes define a "gift" as something extravagant or costly, given on special occasions. Make the effort to help your child see that his/her everyday life is full of simple gifts—the wonders of nature, the joys of time shared with friends, the love shown by family members. This week get out some old sunglasses and for a minute or so each day invite your child to put on the "gift finders" and have them name a few simple gifts from the day. Then you do the same. After you've both had time to find some gifts, be sure to tell your child, "We are so thankful for these gifts."

Read the paragraph about Fra Angelico.

- Share your reactions to the information.
- Look at a picture of Jesus or Mary in your house or talk about where you have seen one.

Turn to Page 55,

Family + Faith Page and conclude with the Let's Pray prayer on this page. Vivos en Cristo, Page 111 **Parents, Consider This:** It's important to form our children in the common language of prayer. We encourage you to pray the Our Father (see Page 317) during your night prayer this week.

God's Gift For Us

Preparation for the Session

Turn to Page 65, the Family + Faith page. *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 131 **Read** the **Consider This** feature. What thoughts or reactions do you have to the opening question?

In this chapter you will cover the following objectives:

- Discover that God created the world to show his love
- Appreciate that all of creation is God's gift to us, and his Son, Jesus, is his greatest gift
- Describe ways that people use God's gifts in the world to make things we need
- Understand that thanksgiving is showing God we are grateful for all that he's given us

Parents, Consider This: Genesis actually begins with two creation accounts (Genesis 1:1–2:4/ Genesis 2:4–25). Common to both stories is the idea that all the wonders of creation are gifts from God to humanity, gifts that humans have a responsibility to cherish. Belief in the goodness of creation was one of the most important convictions that the people of ancient Israel passed on to the Catholic Church. In the course of a challenge in someone's day, you might hear them say "It's all good," as they try to make the best of it. When you grow in the awareness that all creation reflects God's goodness, it gives new meaning to "It's all good!"

INVITE: Encountering God in His Word

Turn to Page 57, God's Gifts for Us *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 115 After gathering the supplies that you will need, find a quiet place to be with your child. This is a sacred time—a time when you will be present to each other and to the Lord. You may want to light a candle as you begin.



Let Us Pray Invite your child to make the Sign of the Cross. Read aloud the Psalm verse from the book. Help your child to respond.

Explain that God created the world and everything in it.

Say: God has created so many wonderful gifts for us to enjoy. Let's listen to a reading from the Book of Genesis.



Guide your child through the Preparing for God's Word Ritual you learned in the Introduction Session or play Track 1 of the Songs of Scripture CD.

- Proclaim God's Word in the Parchment Paper box on the page.
- Maintain several moments of silence.
- Ask: What did vou hear God say to you today?

Invite your child to respond and also share what you heard.

Now, look at the What Do You Wonder? box.

Say: God gives us many different kinds of gifts for us to see and to enjoy as well as to give us life.

Invite your child to respond to the questions. Ask what else she/he might wonder about God's creation and how God thought of so many different things.

DISCOVER: Learning God's Truth

Turn to Page 58, Gifts from God Vivos en Cristo, Page 117 **Point** to the Catholic Faith Words box. Ask your child to find the word that begins with the letter "J." Write the name "Jesus" on an index card. Have your child look at and say his name. Ask him/her to listen for the word Jesus when you read. Tell him/her to stand at the name of Jesus.

Read "Gifts from God" to your child.

Ask: What is the greatest gift God gave us? What are some of the other gifts God gave us?

Share that God gives us the gift of the world and all that is good in it.

Using an index card, review the Catholic Faith Word Jesus and teach the word **praise**.



Point out the directions to the gold-star activity and read them. Have your child work to complete the activity.

Turn to Page 59, God Made the World Vivos en Cristo, Page 119 **Summarize** the paragraph to prepare for the Scripture story.



Proclaim "The Story of Creation."

Tell your child you are going to play a game. He or she should think of something good in God's world that they can act out for you. After you guess what their gift is, then you can act out something God has made. Do this several times.

Emphasize that the whole world and everything in it is God's gift to us.

Turn to Page 60, Made to Help Us Vivos en Cristo, Page 121

Read aloud "Made to Help Us."

Emphasize that God gave us everything we need to live and be happy.

Read aloud the directions to the gold-star activity. Then read the chart aloud together. Share with your child several people in your life that make you happy. Tell the reasons why. Include people your child knows but some he/she does not know. Ask him/her to share some with you.

Remind your child that God gives us people to love and care for us and to be our friends.

Turn to Page 61, Thank God *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 123

Read aloud the first paragraph.

Introduce the word **thanksgiving** from the Catholic Faith Word box.

Read through the list of ways we can tell God thank you. After each sentence, discuss ways in which your family can remember to live these simple steps to holiness.

Turn to Grace After Meals on page 318 of the Our Catholic Tradition reference section in the back of the Student Book for an example of a prayer of thanksqiving.



Read aloud the directions to the activity. Direct your child to do the activity.

Parents, Consider This: Sharing food with others is not only a function of survival but a way we connect with one another. Food feeds our bodies and our souls. Food can be a daily reminder that everything in our lives is a gift—the food we eat, the people that surround us. One of the most basic forms of thanksgiving is the prayer before meals. This prayer is a simple practice to help us become aware of God's gracious gifts. Make a family commitment to pray before you eat no matter where you are.

Turn to Page 52, Our Catholic Life *Vivos en Cristo*, Page 105

Read aloud the first paragraph.

Ask: How do people use the things God made? (Answers may include we use trees to build homes, we use people to care for us, we use plants and animals for food.)

Read the second paragraph aloud. Then read the caption under each picture. Pause after each caption to make sure your child understands the sequence of changing natural substances into prepared food.

Ask: What other things can you make from God's gifts?

Turn to Page 62, People of Faith Vivos en Cristo, Page 125

Read the paragraph about Saint Nicholas.

Share your reactions to the information.

Talk about some ways your family can share your gifts with each other.



Read aloud the directions for the Live Your Faith activity. Talk through the activity together.

Turn to Page 65, Family + Faith Page and conclude with the Let's Pray

prayer on this page. Vivos en Cristo, Page 131

ALIVEIN GRADE 1 CHAPTER 3

Made to Care

Preparation for the Session

Turn to Page 75, the Family + Faith page. *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 151

In this chapter you will cover the following objectives:

- Define image of God as the likeness of God that is in all humans because we are all created by him
- Recognize that humans are the most special part of creation. God gave us the ability to think and make choices
- Understand that God gave Adam and Eve the responsibility to be caretakers of his creation
- Appreciate that each of us is responsible for treating all of creation with care and respect

Read the **Consider This** feature. What thoughts or reactions do you have to the opening question?

Parents, Consider This: Only after God had given care of the Earth over to the man and woman in the Book of Genesis was he able to rest "from all the work he had done in creation" (Genesis 2:3). God gives humans the responsibility and stewardship of his creation. Called to share in God's power, humans have the ability and responsibility to care for other creatures. Forming your children to understand that we are stewards of creation is important. We show love for God by loving the earth. Lead by example. Pick up the paper that litters sidewalks and streets. Take a long walk or hike on a Sunday afternoon. Praise God for flowers, trees, and plants.

INVITE: Encountering God in His Word

Turn to Page 67, Made to Care *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 135 After gathering the supplies that you will need, find a quiet place to be with your child. This is a sacred time—a time when you will be present to each other and to the Lord. You may want to light a candle as you begin.



Let Us Pray Invite your child to make the Sign of the Cross. Read aloud the Psalm verse from the book. Help your child to respond.

Explain to your child that God's gifts are all around them.

Say: God has created so many wonderful gifts for us to enjoy. Now, let's hear who God put in charge to take care of his creation.

Guide your child through the Preparing for God's Word Ritual you learned in the Introduction Session or play Track 1 of the Songs of Scripture CD.

- Proclaim God's Word in the Parchment Paper box on the page.
- Maintain several moments of silence.
- Ask: What did vou hear God say to you today?

Invite your child to respond and also share what you heard.

Now, look at the What Do You Wonder? box.

Say: God asks us to take care of everyone and everything that was created.

Ask: What else she/he might wonder about God's creation and how we can take care of everything God made.

DISCOVER: Learning God's Truth

Turn to Page 68, In God's Image Vivos en Cristo, Page 137

Read aloud the paragraph.

Hold up an index card with the phrase **image of God** written on it. With the help of the Catholic Faith Words box, explain the meaning of the phrase, "People are made to be like God."

Look at the picture on the page. Ask your child to tell you what the people might be doing. Do these people know each other?

Read aloud the story which continues on page 69.

Turn to Page 69, Gifts in Creation Vivos en Cristo, Page 139

Ask: What did Josh make? What can people do that cookies cannot do? What is your favorite thing that we do together?

Read the first paragraph aloud.

Ask: Why are people the most special part of creation?

Read the second paragraph aloud.

Invite your child to name some of the gifts from God in the world that she/he learned about from the last lesson.

Ask: How are you a part of God's creation? (Answers may include God created me, or I can care for creation.)

Discuss how people should share their gifts from God.



Read the directions for the gold-star activity. Direct the children to underline two gifts that are inside each person.



Ask your child to explain how a person is different than a tree. Explain how a person is different than a bird. Now, ask your child to draw themselves choosing to be a sign of God's love. (sharing a toy, taking care of a pet, etc.)

Parents, Consider This: The next several pages will reinforce God's command that we take care of all that he has given us. That command includes the personal care of our bodies, minds, and spirit. Taking your child to the doctor, caring for scrapes and bruises, providing health foods and "nagging" him/her to brush teeth, are some of the ways you help your child learn to honor his/her body as a gift from God. The gift of health and well-being is of such incredible value. We praise God when we take care of that invaluable gift.

Turn to Page 70, God's Command *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 141 **Read** aloud the introduction.

Explain that in the following Scripture story, God tells humans how to show him love and thanks for creation.



Proclaim "Take Care of What I've Given You."

Read the directions for the gold-star activity. Direct your child to circle in the text what God asked Adam and Eve to do. Talk with her/him about practical ways they can be a partner with God. Make a list of three things that you will do and three things that she/he will do to be good stewards. (Walk the dog without complaining. Use less paper towels, or both sides of a piece of paper.) Perhaps she/he could play detective for a week and discover the ways your family might be wasting water, food, or other resources.

Point out the stained glass window. Ask your child to share some of the gifts of creation that they see in the window. Open the discussion to include things that are gifts from God that she/he has seen in nature.

Turn to Page 71, Show Love *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 143 Read aloud "Show Love."

Ask: How can you show your love for God? (I can care for living things.) How can you thank God for all that he has given you? (I can be a caretaker.)

Hold up an index card of the word **caretaker**. Invite your child to name some habits a good caretaker should have.



Have your child trace the letters to complete the sentence. Read the statement together and ask your child, "Who said those words?"

LIVE: Living Our Faith

Turn to Page 72,

Our Catholic Life Vivos en Cristo, Page 145

Read aloud the first paragraph.

Ask: How do you help take care of yourself? (bathing, eating healthy foods, getting plenty of rest, exercising)

Point out the lists of ways to care for the body and mind. Have your child follow along as you read the lists aloud.

Direct attention to the pictures and ask how the children depicted are taking care of themselves.

Say: Place a check mark next to the things you like to do best.

Ask: What other things can you do to take care of yourself? (read books, dance, play sports, play a musical instrument)

Turn to Page 73,

People of Faith Vivos en Cristo, Page 147

Read the paragraph about Saint Albert the Great.

Share your reactions to the information.

Talk about some ways your family can see creation as God's gift.



Discuss the Live Your Faith activity. Each of you choose one way you will take better care of yourself this week.

Turn to Page 75,

Family + Faith Page and conclude with the Let's Pray prayer on this page. Vivos en Cristo, Page 151

Parents, Consider This: It's important to form our children in the common language of prayer. We encourage you to pray the Our Father (see Page 317) during your night prayer this week.

Preparation for the Session

Turn to Page 89, the Family + Faith page. *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 179

In this chapter you will cover the following objectives:

- Understand that God asks us to be friends with one another, to be nice and to help each other when in need
- Identify Jesus as the Son of God who shows us the way to his Father
- Appreciate that God the Father loves us so much he sent his only Son to be with us
- Describe the Holy Trinity as God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, the one God in three Divine Persons

Turn to Page 81, The Holy Trinity Vivos en Cristo, Page 163 **Read** the **Consider This** feature. What thoughts or reactions do you have to the opening question?

Parents, Consider This: Recall the first moment of meeting your child through adoption or at birth. This is a valuable source of prayerful meditation to appreciate God's love. If we can recognize how deeply we love our child, then we have a hint of God's love for us. The next time you pray together with your child, express out loud your love for your child.

INVITE: Encountering God in His Word

Let Us Pray Invite your child to make the Sign of the Cross. Read aloud the Psalm verse from the book. Help your child to respond.

Explain that when we pray the Sign of the Cross, we are marking ourselves and showing that we belong to God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

Say: When we were baptized we were called by name. God calls us by name to show his love in this world. Let's listen to a reading from the Gospel of Matthew.

Guide your child through the Preparing for God's Word Ritual you learned in the Introduction Session or play Track 1 of the *Songs of Scripture* CD.

- Proclaim God's Word in the Parchment Paper box on the page.
- Maintain several moments of silence.
- Ask: What did you hear God say to you today?

Invite your child to respond and also share what you heard.

Now, look at the What Do You Wonder? box.

Say: Each of us was given a special name by which we are called.

Invite your child to respond to the questions. Prompt what your child might wonder about the importance of his or her name.

DISCOVER: Learning God's Truth

Turn to Page 82, Helping Others *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 165 **Read** aloud the introductory paragraph.

Ask your child to listen to how the lion and the mouse solve their problem.

Read the story, "The Lion and the Mouse." Cue your child to roar when the lion roars.

Ask: Why did the lion think that the mouse could never repay him? (because the mouse was too small to help a big lion) What did the lion learn? (even though you are smaller than someone else, it doesn't mean you can't help them)



Do the gold-star activity with your child.

Turn to Page 83, The Lion and the Mouse *Vivos en Cristo*, Page 167



Do the Share Your Faith activity. Discuss the second part of the activity with your child.

Parents, Consider This: Learning to find joy in helping others is a value that is cultivated when children grow up in a family who happily serve others often and don't expect a reward. Know that each time you encourage your child to join you in helping others, your child learns that service is a wonderful way to live

Invite your child to quietly think of someone who is a good friend to him or her and have them refect on why they think that person is a good friend.

Turn to Page 84, God is Love *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 169 **Read** aloud the first two paragraphs.

Tell your child that we can know God's love by seeing how wonderfully we are made. Say that we can recognize God's love in the things he created.

Have your child read over the Catholic Faith Words definitions God the Father and Son of God.

Read the last paragraph.

Tell your child that Jesus likes to talk about his Father just the way we like to talk about our family.



Proclaim the Scripture story, "The Way to the Father."

Ask: How does Jesus show you God the Father's love? (he cares about me; he wants me to know more about him; he makes me strong)

Turn to Page 85, The Holy Trinity *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 171 **Read** aloud the information on the this page.

Direct your child to the Catholic Faith Word **Holy Trinity** and read the definition to your child.



Read the directions for the Connect Your Faith activity to your child. Have your child complete the activity.

Parents, Consider This: Jesus Christ, God's Son, reveals the Father's true nature to humans in a way that no mere prophet or teacher, however good and wise, could have done. Jesus came bearing God the Father's love. He sends his Church in mission to share this divine love with others. A family is where we learn to share that love with others. No act of kindness or forgiveness or compassion in your family is ever too small to reveal God's love.

LIVE: Living Our Faith

Turn to Page 86, Our Catholic Life *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 173 *Ask:* What do we know about God? (God loves everyone; God cares for us; God the Father sent Jesus to the world to teach us how to love)

Read aloud the first paragraph.

Invite your child to follow along as you read the bulleted text.



Do the gold-star activity.

Parents, Consider This: Though your child cannot see God, your child can experience God's presence whenever he or she is loved or loves. Point out a time when you've seen your child showing or receiving love. Remind your child that we can recognize God's presence in these loving moments.

Read aloud the rest of the page.

Turn to Page 87,

People of Faith Vivos en Cristo, Page 175 Read the paragraph about Saint Patrick.

- Share your reactions to the information.
- Talk about ways your family can show your faith in the Trinity.



Read the directions for the Live Your Faith activity. Help your child complete the activity.

Parents, Consider This: God's love is greater than any love that we can show our children. The most important way you can show your love for your child is to pass on your faith to them. In your prayer this week, thank God for all those who helped you grow and taught you about God so that you have a faith to share with your child.

Turn to Page 89,

Family + Faith Page and conclude with the Let's Pray prayer on this page. *Vivos en Cristo*, Page 179 **Parents, Consider This:** It's important to form our children in the common language of prayer. We encourage you to pray the Glory Be (see Page 316), during your night prayer this week.

Preparation for the Session

Turn to Page 99,

the Family + Faith page. Vivos en Cristo, Page 199

In this chapter you will help your child to:

- Identify signs of love expressed in families
- Recognize Jesus as the Son of God and a human
- Define the Holy Family as the human family of Mary, Joseph and Jesus
- Appreciate that Jesus grew up with Mary and Joseph in Nazareth, praying and learning

Read the Consider This feature. What thoughts or reactions do you have to the opening question?

Parents, Consider This: We all learn from the behaviors and the values we see lived out in others, often from those who are older or come before us. When we observe virtues we admire lived in other families, we may be inspired to cultivate them in our own family. Who has been a model for you and your family? Who do you see as a model of love in family life? The Holy Family of Mary, Joseph, and Jesus are a model for Catholic families. They lived unselfish love and a faithful observance of faith in family life. The virtues lived in the Holy Family are something to reflect upon and remember.

There is much in the role of the shepherd that a mother or father can identify with in the way parents care for their family. The stories of Scripture can inspire us in our roles of protector and caretaker of our family.

Turn to Page 103, Our Shepherd Vivos en Cristo, Page 207 **Ask** your child what lesson Jesus is teaching about God's love in the story of the Lost Sheep. (Everyone is important to God. God wants us to come back to him even if we get lost.)

Parents, Consider This: Forgiveness is a learned process. While teaching responsibility and accountability, Scripture also reminds us to temper that with understanding and forgiveness. Tell your child to hold up the side with the word "yes" if the place is a place to pray, and the side with the word "no" if it isn't. (The "yes" side should be held toward you each time. This reinforces the concept that prayer can take place anywhere.)



Have your child complete the Share Your Faith activity.

Turn to Page 138, Learn to Pray *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 277

Read aloud the opening question and the two paragraphs.

Explain that every generation of Catholics learns certain prayers. We also learn certain songs that are sung in church on Sundays.



Read the Scripture to your child.



Do the gold-star activity.

Parents, Consider This: This part of the letter to the Ephesians instructs Christian converts on how to live as followers of Christ. The writer stresses that convert's lives should be filled with prayer. They should pray together and sing as a group, but they should pray individually, in their hearts. Remind your child that Jesus called on God the Father, and asked us to do so, too.

Turn to Page 139, The Lord's Prayer *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 279

Read aloud the introductory paragraph and then read the definition for the Catholic Faith Word, **Lord's Prayer**.

Ask: Have you heard of the Lord's Prayer?

Explain that the Lord, Jesus, taught the first Christians this prayer.

Read aloud the Lord's Prayer. Tell your child that since he or she is a friend of Jesus, the Lord's Prayer is for them. Explain that, at every Mass, the Church family stands and prays this prayer aloud. Help your child understand the words by suggesting synonyms for any words they don't understand.



Have your child complete the Connect Your Faith activity.

Parents, Consider This: Explain to your child the difficult words in the first part of the prayer: "who art" means you who are (addressed to God), "hallowed" means called or treated as holy, "thy kingdom" means God's rule on Earth, "thy will" means what God wants people to do.

Invite your child to think of other choices, such as which of two games to play or which of two television shows to watch.

Read aloud both paragraphs. Remind your child that choices between right and wrong are sometimes hard to make.

Ask: What are some choices children your age make? Have them share some examples from his/her experience at home. (giving the remote to a sibling, respecting the property of a sibling by not taking without asking)

Turn to Page 195, A Gift from God Vivos en Cristo, Page 391

Read aloud the first paragraph.

Ask your child to share a rule you have at home.

Explain that the Ten Commandments are a gift from God that help people make good choices.

Say: The Ten Commandments were given to a leader named Moses.



Proclaim "God's Commandments."

Review the definition for the **Ten Commandments** in the Catholic Faith Words Box.

Ask your child to tell you how she/he knows what is a loving thing to do.

Turn to Page 196, Good Choices *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 393 Read aloud all three paragraphs.

Show your child index cards with the words **obey** and **free will** on them. Read aloud and explain their definitions.

Fold a separate sheet of blank paper turned sideways in half. On the left half, write in large print, "What is the loving thing to do?" On the second half, write in large print, "What God tells us." Explain to your child that God teaches us what is the good and loving thing to do by giving us the Ten Commandments.

Ask your child to draw an equal sign in the middle of the page, across the fold.

Say: Disciples of Jesus choose to love by following the Ten Commandments.

Review the steps to good choices. You may want to cut this chart out and place it on your refrigerator. Refer to it when your child has made a good or bad choice. Let it become the basis for all her/his decisions.

Turn to Page 197, Consequences Vivos en Cristo, Page 395 **Read** aloud the paragraph.

Explain that the word "consequence" means the results of a choice.

Point out the photo. Ask your child to describe what they see in the picture. Discuss what kinds of choices this child made that lead to the consequences he/she sees in the picture.



Have your child complete the Connect Your Faith activity.

Listen to the song, "His Laws Make Us Free" on the *Songs of Scripture* Album, Track 8. The lyrics can be downloaded from aliveinchrist.osv.com. Pay particular attention to the line, "Those who love you will help it grow." Play the song in your car this week.

They are not people we want to interact with on a regular basis, as it gets tiring just watching how they shift blame and dodge consequences. Truth be told, this behavior began as a child. It is a blessing to your child that you are teaching him/her that choices have consequences. It's an even greater blessing to not try to soften or eradicate the consequences of your child's choices. God has given you the responsibility to guide their choices, to pray for them to make the right choices, and to love them enough to help them accept the consequences of their choices.

Give an example of a time when your child did something wrong that was truly an accident. Ask him/her to give you an example of something he/she did that was an accident, as well.

Proclaim "The Forgiving Father."

Ask your child to retell the story in their own words by asking him/her what happened in the beginning, middle, and end of the story.

Ask: Who asks for forgiveness in the story? (the younger brother) How does the father react? (he forgives his son, he throws a party for his son, he hugs his son)

Explain that when we sin, God wants us to ask for forgiveness like the younger son in the story. When we are sorry and ask for forgiveness, God will always forgive us, just like the father in the story.

Tell your child a story about something you did wrong as a child and the forgiveness that someone offered you. Forgiveness is a great sign of someone's love for you.

Turn to Page 206, Ask for Forgiveness *Vivos en Cristo,* Page 413 **Read** aloud the text.



Complete the gold-star activity.

Explain to your child that to forgive someone is to let go of our anger about what someone has done.

Ask: How does it feel when you say, "I'm sorry," and are forgiven?

Tell your child that saying "I'm sorry" and "I forgive you" go together like two pieces of a puzzle—they mend a friendship, whether the friendship is between two people or between a person and God.

Ask: How does God know if you are sorry for not obeying him?

Point out the picture. Ask your child to tell you what she/he sees in the picture. Discuss what might be happening in the picture.

Turn to Page 207, Make Things Better *Vivos en Cristo*, Page 415

Read aloud the first and second paragraphs.

Parents, Consider This: God's forgiveness is an overwhelming gift. It is a humbling experience to stand guilty and yet trust in a love so unconditional that it will offer you pardon and peace. Here is the problem: we can cross the line and start to think that we can do whatever we want because we will always be forgiven. In a human relationship, we would call that taking advantage of someone, or more accurately, abusive. When you authentically love someone, you want to respond lovingly. God's love is so perfect that he cannot love you more tomorrow than he does today. Our choices are always held in the light of that perfect love.

Tell your child that through Baptism, a person becomes a member of God's family, the Church. Have your child pour more water into the bowl. Explain that in Baptism, we become children of God. Keep the bowl and water out.

Discuss how you welcome people into your home. How do you make people feel welcome?

Turn to Page 239, Welcome! (cont'd) Vivos en Cristo, Page 479 Say: You are going to hear a Bible Story about Baptism.



Proclaim the Scripture in the Parchment Paper box.

Explain that after Jesus died, he sent his Apostles out into the world to share the Good News and baptize people.

Read aloud the two paragraphs. Pour the remaining water into the bowl and tell your child that the Holy Spirit comes to us through Baptism and gives us the strength to do Jesus' work.

Review the highlighted words, **Baptism** and **grace**, and their definitions in the Catholic Faith Words box.



Have your child complete the Share Your Faith activity.

Parents, Consider This: In Baptism, a person is cleansed of Original Sin and any personal sin. In Baptism, we are welcomed into the Church and we become God's child. We receive grace to lead a holy life. Help your child grasp the multiple meanings of this Sacrament by talking about them. Above all, share that God's life and love are a gift given to us, and we call this gift grace.

Explain that the container in which people are baptized is called a font. Tell your child you will show the actions and say the words that are most important in Baptism. Refill the pitcher of water. Using the bowl, pour the water three times, once for each member of the Holy Trinity. Do it again and have your child say the words with you as you pour the water.

Proclaim "The Last Supper."



Complete the gold-star activity.

Ask: When do you hear these words at Mass? Explain that the priest says these words when God changes the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ.

Tell your child that Jesus promised that he would always be with his friends. Explain that Jesus is present in every Sacrament.

Turn to Page 253, Giving Thanks Vivos en Cristo, Page 507

Read aloud the paragraph.

Show an index card to introduce your child to the Catholic Faith Word, **Eucharist**. Have your child practice pronouncing the word. Read the definition from the Catholic Faith Words Box. Ask your child to retell it to you in his/her own words.

Tell your child that the Eucharist has words and actions that show that Jesus is present.

Ask if she/he recalls the words of Jesus that the priest says during Mass. Tell your child that the priest and people at Mass continue to do what Jesus told the disciples to do at the Last Supper.

Explain that Jesus' Body and Blood are under the appearances of bread and wine, by saying, "It still looks like bread and wine, but it is really Jesus himself."

Read aloud the two paragraphs.

Show your child index cards with the Catholic Faith Words, **Mass** and **Holy Communion**, written on them. Read their definitions in the Catholic Faith Words box. Ask your child to retell it to you in his/her own words.

Point out the pictures.

Ask: What things do Catholics do at Mass?

Have your child name key words from each caption of the pictures on this page and on page 255. (gather, sing, pray, listen to readings, Body and Blood of Jesus, receive Jesus in Holy Communion)
