Yet, my love for you will never have an end.



Verse 3


We hunger today for the food of our

Verse 3


Help us honor you,

To love your God with all your heart.**


**The second is like it, so listen well:

Verse 3


Care for each other and those that you

Verse 3


Jerusalem is now a sign for

Verse 4


We are now his disciples called to witness everywhere.
